Annual Review 2022 - 2023





About Style Acre

271 adults with learning disabilities and autism are supported by Style Acre across Oxfordshire. We offer supported living and day opportunities through our community hubs, employment support, wellbeing activities and gardening sessions.

People we support may have mild, moderate or severe and profound learning disabilities and/or autism. Style Acre works closely with its sister charity Acre Housing who provide specialised housing for some of the people supported by Style Acre.

Overview of 2022

In March 2023

- 109 people were accessing support from our supported living care teams in 37 households, 95% of which have 24-hour care.
- 32 people who live more independently or with their family in the community were supported from their homes by our community support team.
- 162 people attended our day opportunities which include three community hubs in Wallingford, Didcot and Banbury, a shared market garden in Wantage and a Work Programme.
- Our own social enterprises provide work opportunities for people we support the Style Acre Tea Room in Blewbury, the Style Acre Charity Shop in Wallingford and Green Acre, our garden maintenance business.
- We focus on promoting and delivering accessible wellbeing activities for the people we support and our employees through our Ways to Wellness project.

The year has seen Style Acre largely return to 'normal' after the restrictions brought in during the COVID-19 pandemic.

- Regular activities, hobbies, work and outings have returned.
- Our employees have gone above and beyond to help people we support to rebuild social connections and to reconnect with their communities. Providing outstanding personalised support to manage any anxieties.
- Our community hubs are back to delivering their normal timetables, along with new activities.
- Our Work Programme has supported people to return to their work and voluntary placements during the year and new placements started.
- Our garden project at Wantage Market Garden has continued to offer opportunities for 1:1 and group activities.
- Our social enterprises have increased the number of work opportunities.
- Our Ways to Wellness project has gone from strength to strength, encouraging employees and the people we support to work towards goals to improve their physical and mental health.
- Our mental health programme has continued, with 34 wellbeing buddies across all of our services supporting our employees and the people we support as needed.

Spotlight - Work Programme

Katy-Anne enjoys working at the Tea Room every week and feels valued and fulfilled in her role. She really enjoys working front of house and using the till as she likes to meet and chat to the customers. Katy-Anne's mum says "Katy-Anne has had various opportunities over the years to do cookery and catering courses, and to work in coffee shops in 'closed' settings...I was delighted when I found that Style Acre's Tea Room would give her a chance to use her skills in a real commercial setting, interacting with members of the public, but with support as and when needed.."





Fundraising, Volunteering, Community

2022/23 was packed full of fundraising and community events, we joined Jubilee Celebrations in Didcot and Blewbury, held a Masquerade Ball and a Halloween Disco. We also ran annual events such as Style Acre's Got Talent, Wallingford Santa Dash, Tea Room Summer Fete and Outdoor Cinema. We also attended local events and festivals.

We are very grateful to the people that supported us through completing many different challenges including the London Marathon, Oxford Half Marathon, Blenheim 7k and Iron Man UK.

Grants from charitable trusts enabled us to deliver services such as our Work Programme and Garden Project. Support from individuals, companies and local groups helps us provide amazing opportunities for people we support.

Over 40 volunteers help us at our social enterprises, our hubs, with gardening sessions and at our fundraising and community events. Teams of company volunteers have also worked wonders at our hubs, gardens and supported living houses. We appreciate every hour given by our volunteers, their time makes a big difference to people we support.






Financial Performance

■ Supported Living: £8075,498


■ Day Opportunities: £1,686,037
